

Residents to also leave bagged extra waste at the side of their refuse bin when the crews do their first collection after the holidays. You can recycle real Christmas trees in your green bin provided the lid can still be shut. Trees can be shredded and composted at Batsford Garden Centre (Moreton) between 2 and 14 January.

Rights of Way under threat
