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### Agenda item 9 (e) - Neighbourhood Development Planning (NDP)

Recent changes to planning guidelines (the NPPF) have retained Neighbourhood Development Plans. NDPs have legal status and must be consulted by the local planning authority when any developments are being considered in the area which has an NDP. Other changes to the NPPF are in the consultation phase. An NDP could offer protection from the main issues currently facing the parish and any changes proposed by local land owners:

- housing (and other) development on a number of sites which are currently protected under NPPF regulations
- changes in NPPF regulations which could affect the parish (not yet available).
- further extensions to quarrying e.g. re-opening of quarries currently closed/ enlargement of other quarries.
- increased shooting

A Neighbourhood Development Plan could provide some protection for the parish, once approved by the residents and CDC. A working party, with clearly defined terms of reference, would carry out the work without involving the full council in every decision but would be expected to report to each full council meeting. The Working Party should aim to include residents who are not on the PC but who have an interest and/or expertise in an aspect (such as planning, housing, environment, strong community links etc) which would contribute to the success of the Working Party.

GRCC and other organisations such as Locality can provide templates and advice on each stage of the Plan as well as help with applying for grants.

Current advice from GRCC is that the project could be simplified by focusing on just one or two elements e.g. Housing, the village hall. The project would also have a head start in that the 'Looking to the future' document produced by Cllr Krier provides a good starting point. The working party would need to define the scope of the plan. Another action which the working party would need to carry out at the start of the project is a consultation with residents. This would establish residents' concerns and set the direction which the working party should take.

There is a great deal of support available from a number of sources. For example, this is the <a href="CPRE guide">CPRE guide</a> - it has lots of further resources at the end including online training. Cllr Morrissey has attended a briefing session held by GAPTC (see report at agenda item 8). Cllr Mather has registered for the CPRE online training with planning expert and Trustee David Crofts on Tuesday 1st and Tuesday 8th October 2024. This also includes an update on the latest developments in planning regs.

## Latest update on Highways actions dated 29th July 2024

Colours show additions from Rhodri, Tim and TGPC to Bob Skillern's initial requests. Purple is the Clerk's response.

1.	Barton Bridge The 'additional signage' request response was February 2023 I am not sure of the detail of this request but assume it refers to a sign giving some protection to the bridge parapet on the offside as you approach the bridge from the Guiting direction. If so then a small Chevron would be the most suitable option. There is one but it's overgrown. I'll need to get someone to cut greenery back. Tim will add this to the community gang list of work. If you could provide a what3words location so I know where to raise a ticket for to action. W3W is widest.registers.prouder. Yes, it is the location you describe and yes, there is a slightly overgrown chevron, but it might also help people to avoid crashing into the bridge if there was a single chevron at the base of the bridge wall or something similar.	Gang to action.
	Barton house bollards. Vergemaster bollards for the northwestern approach to Barton bridge – The existing cones were placed some time ago after complaints from the residents of Barton House, that the verge, their gate and driveway were being damaged by HGV traffic, so they were not placed as a road safety concern. However, if the Parish feel Bollards would be a better option, we can certainly arrange for some to be installed. Obviously if the Parish were willing to contribute to the funding that would be greatly appreciated and would expedite the work. yes the PC would prefer bollards to cones. The Vergemaster bollards were recommended - priced around £33 each - and the PC would certainly consider a donation. Would you let me know what the PC should do next to have these installed.	?
2.	'Unsuitable for motors' sign on Mill Lane – Rhodri will arrange for installation of this sign as requested. Not on Rhodri's recent update but we will send a reminder. Rhodri/Tim can you please action this. I visited site with Rhodri, driving the length of Mill Lane to Critchford Lane, there were "Not Suitable for Motor Vehicles" at each entrance, albeit some vegetation from the adjacent landowner from the Temple Guiting junction. If you could advise via a what3words location where these signs are missing/required, then we can action further.W3W is hasten.snippet.parkland. it's at the end of Sheep Barn Lane, where it meets Mill Lane. Matters arising from the previous meeting

Proposal to clarify standing orders where a meeting relates to a planning application following Ward's Piece application.

Ref Item 10 in the minutes for July's meeting, the clerk contacted GAPTC to check whether this was a matter for CDC or GAPTC. As it did not appear to be a disciplinary matter, GAPTC responded as per two notes below:

1. "If the Code of Conduct has been approved, then the PC must follow the Code" and

Based on the information provided, now I have a better understanding of the issue, and context, it seems you are dealing with a situation where there is some confusion regarding the application of the Standing Orders, particularly clauses 13(b) and 13(c), in the context of planning meetings. Here is an analysis of the situation and some advice on how to proceed:

#### **Analysis of Clauses**

- \* Clause 13(b): This clause mandates that any Councillor or non-Councillor with voting rights must withdraw from a meeting when a matter in which they have a disclosable pecuniary interest is being considered, unless they have been granted a dispensation.
- \* Clause 13(c): This clause specifies that for planning applications, if there is a personal interest, the individual can make a statement to the Parish Council but must leave the meeting during discussions.

#### **Potential Conflict**

The apparent conflict arises because:

- \* Clause 13(b) implies complete withdrawal during discussions of any matter where there is a disclosable pecuniary interest.
- \* Clause 13(c) seems to allow for a personal interest to be declared, a statement made, and then the individual must leave, without specifying the type of interest (pecuniary or non-pecuniary).

#### Your Application of Clauses

Your approach, which was to allow the Councillor to deliver a statement but not to attend during the discussion, seems to align both clauses reasonably. You treated the personal interest in planning applications as a subset of pecuniary interest, ensuring transparency and compliance with the broader intent of the Standing Orders.

The Role of CDC (Cotswold District Council)

CDC generally handles issues of discipline and failure to abide by the Code of Conduct, rather than specific procedural interpretations of Parish Council Standing Orders.

\* Update the Councillor and Council: Once fully considered, I would encourage a Summary report for the September meeting outlining the findings and any recommended actions. This will demonstrate due diligence and ensure that all Councillors are informed of the correct procedures

moving forward.

By following these steps, you can hopefully address the current confusion, ensure future compliance with the Code of Conduct, and maintain transparency in Council proceedings.

As a result the following changes to the standing orders are proposed:

#### CODE OF CONDUCT AND DISPENSATIONS

See also Standing Order 3(u).

- a) All Councillors and non-Councillors with voting rights shall observe the code of conduct adopted by the Council.
- b) Unless he has been granted a dispensation, a Councillor or non-Councillor with voting rights shall withdraw from a meeting when it is considering a matter in which he has a disclosable pecuniary interest. He may return to the meeting after it has considered the matter in which he had the interest.
- c) With regard to planning applications, if there is a personal interest a statement can be made to the Parish Council meeting but then the person must leave the meeting while discussions take place.

With regard to planning applications, —if there is a personal interest —aa councillor may not be present when the matter of a planning application in which they have a disclosable pecuniary interest is discussed. However, they may provide the Chairman with a prepared statement to be read for them to read out at the meeting.

The Department for Communities and Local Government 'Openness and Transparency on Personal Interests: A guide for Councillors' (when referring to disclosable pecuniary interests) states:

#### Where these prohibitions apply, do I also have to leave the room?

Where your council's or authority's standing orders require this, you must leave the room. Even where there are no such standing orders, you must leave the room if you consider your continued presence is incompatible with your council's code of conduct or the Seven Principles of Public Life.'

The Guide also says:

'Holders of public office must avoid placing themselves under any obligation to people or organisations that might inappropriately influence them in their work. **They should not act** 

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or take decisions in order to gain financial or other material benefits for themselves, their family or their friends.'

In the Guide, disclosable pecuniary interests include: 'Any beneficial interest in land which you or your spouse or your civil partner have and which is within the area of your council or authority'.

### Other matters arising:

- \* Completed forms to join the NALC Micro Council network for small councils with a precept of under £10,000. The network has been founded to help smaller councils share issues and solutions. The first meeting is in November.
- \* Replied to resident enquiries.
- \* Further discussions with Royal Mail re re-siting the post box in Ford and land ownership.
- \* Provided Cllr Wilkins with submission requesting that the CDC Planning Committee review 24/00066/FUL New Barn Farm.
- \* Further discussions with GCC Highways regarding the provision of a new VAS pole in Ford and responsibility for the bollards at Barton. Emails from GCC are not all consistent.
