1.	<b>Barton Bridge</b> The 'additional signage' request response was February 2023 I am not sure of the detail of this request but assume it refers to a sign giving some protection to the bridge parapet on the offside as you approach the bridge from the Guiting direction. If so then a small Chevron would be the most suitable option. There is one but it's overgrown. I'll need to get someone to cut greenery back. Tim will add this to the community gang list of work. If you could provide a what3words location so I know where to raise a ticket for to action. W3W is widest.registers.prouder. Yes, it is the location you describe and yes, there is a slightly overgrown chevron, but it might also help people to avoid crashing into the bridge if there was a single chevron at the base of the bridge wall or something similar. 2.	Barton house bollards. Vergemaster bollards for the northwestern approach to Barton bridge – The existing cones were placed some time ago after complaints from the residents of Barton House, that the verge, their gate and driveway were being damaged by HGV traffic, so they were not placed as a road safety concern. However, if the Parish feel Bollards would be a better option, we can certainly arrange for some to be installed. Obviously if the Parish were willing to contribute to the funding that would be greatly appreciated and would expedite the work. yes the PC would prefer bollards to cones. The Vergemaster bollards were recommended - priced around £33 each - and the PC would certainly consider a donation. Would you let me know what the PC should do next to have these installed. #### Agenda item 8 (c ) – South splash at Kineton

From Cotswold Volunteer Wardens:

4) Regarding the eroded highway below Kineton, Highways are not prepared to do anything - see below. I have been advised that the simplest thing to do is add some staked cement bags along the edge of the water and back fill. Technically the surface is not the river so the Environment Agency would not need to be involved. If the Parish Council wished to fund some bags and some stone to put behind then I am sure the Wardens could provide the labour. Did you wish to discuss with the Parish Council and come back to me?

### FYI re: SoluForm Prefilled Concrete Bagwork:

1 pallet = 50 bags or 0.69m3 or 2.5 M2 Below water bags cost £473 + VAT per pallet Above water bags cost £345 + VAT per pallet Additional cost: Securing pins 20 per 50 bags/pallet at £1.35 + VAT per pin (£27 per pallet)

Rough estimate £4,000:

5 metres x 3 layers = 6 pallets of below water bags =  $\pounds$ 2,838.

Plus pins £162, Plus aggregate behind the concrete wall appx £3-400.

**Note** that the path may have to meet specific guidelines for accessibility and safety which is likely to increase costs due to a higher specification. See <u>The Ramblers</u> for information 'local authorities are required to make reasonable adaptations ...'. there is also funding for improving paths for less abled users. <u>path-accessibility-fund-faqs.pdf</u>

#### 9 (g) Neighbourhood Development Planning.

GRCC (Gloucestershire Rural Community Council) has informed parish councils that "Cotswolds housing numbers have vastly increased due to the need to build 1.5 million homes. This is going to leave the District council in a difficult position as these homes have to be delivered somewhere.

The Cotswolds is a very attractive area for speculative development due to very high values areas, this will leave parishes and neighbourhoods at the mercy of Open Market Housing, which

could be in the wrong location and not necessarily the type needed to meet local housing needs for people of the Parish. "
